Diagnostic Records - Make or Break Treatment Outcomes

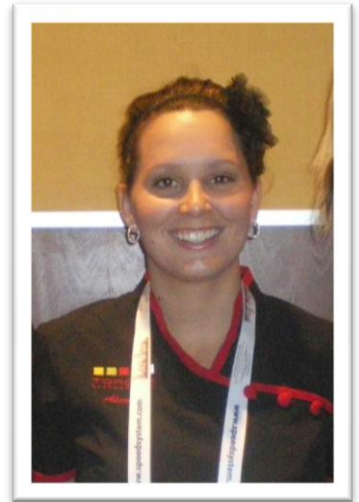
#### **Main objective of the presentation:**

#### **Why do you enjoy working in the orthodontic field?**

Enjoying your work is all about keeping motivated. Orthodontics for me is that motivation. In my senior dental assistant position at Torque Orthodontics. I am actively involved in training of staff, rosters, ordering stock, keeping up to date with new products, equipment maintenance, infection control policy and procedures and attending conferences. Orthodontics enables me to keep learning and improving on my skills such as gaining my qualifications in intra-oral and extra-oral radiography. The highlight of my career was presenting at the recent World Federation Orthodontic Conference in Sydney. Orthodontics is a field of dentistry where our patients want to visit us and enjoy being involved in our practice. We make life-changing effects and boost our patient's self-esteem in the process of straightening their teeth and correcting their bite. What you consider are your strengths and what the practice needs to improve upon is a never ending process.

#### ***What is needed to further education for hygienists/assistants?***

Training programs in the future for Orthodontic assistants and hygienists need to have a strong focus on not only the theoretical component but also the practical component. Past experience has shown us that courses provided by tertiary institutions have allocated only a minor percentage of clinical time to gaining orthodontic skills. This is the factor that I identify as a weakness from the majority of training providers. Students that complete their practical components in these tertiary institutions can lack the clinical, hands on skills required when they enter the workforce. Providing students with the opportunity to complete some of their practical orthodontic components in the field can give them the true feel of the dynamics of a successful working Orthodontic practice. In addition, course providers need to be mindful of the legal issues involved with regard to duties and responsibilities of orthodontic assistants and hygienists. Duties and responsibilities are currently governed by state and national dental boards. Presently in Australia these are different for each state.

#### ***Goals for the Future:***

My goal for the future is to work toward improving career paths for our profession. The skills I have acquired over last ten years from my career at Torque Orthodontics provides me with the tools (which includes formal and non-formal training) and confidence achieve this goal.
